**1. Modelling/statistical expertise when the NNR2022 Committee shall revise or set DRVs and FBDGs**

Postponed until April 7.

**2. Paper on "Use of DRVs and FBDGs in NNR2022"**

As described in previous meeting minutes, the chapter "Use of NNR" from NNR2012 will be updated as two separate papers in NNR2022. Both papers will be submitted to Food & Nutrition Research. The Committee are making progress with the manuscript, however further revision is needed before the manuscript is ready for submission. The Committee discussed the general considerations and principles for setting dietary reference values and how, and why, the methodology may be adjusted compared to NNR2012.

**3. Systematic Reviews (SRs) conducted by Nordic and Baltic health authorities**

The NNR2022 Committee discussed how the NNR project could collaborate and use SRs conducted by the Nordic and Baltic health authorities. A prerequisite for this is that the health authorities and the NNR project uses the same methodology for conducting SRs. The Norwegian Scientific Committee for Food and Environment is conducting a SR on "risk-benefit assessment of fish in the Norwegian diet" and the NNR2022 Committee discussed whether this SRs could be incorporated in NNR2022.

**4. Sustainability**

The NNR2022 Committee discussed the program for the webinar on "diet and sustainability" on April 22. Further, the Committee discussed the Nordic experts that will be invited as co-authors on the background papers together with Chatham House. The Committee will start to invite the Nordic experts during the next weeks. When the Nordic authors accept the invitation, this will be announced at our official web-page. Nordic expertise is needed within food systems (food waste, production, consumption, distribution, and processing) to ensure that local aspects are included.

**5. Scoping Reviews (ScR)**

ScRs for all 51 chapters are now finalized.
